

# IDENTITY: DISCOVERING WHAT WE REALLY BELIEVE ABOUT OURSELVES

# SESSION 2: REPLACING LIES WITH TRUTH

If we do the work of pinpointing a false belief we're carrying, then we can attack it and replace it with the one thing it can't stand—the truth.

### BEFORE

For this session, everyone should have an index card and something to write with.

#### WIN

Learn to replace false beliefs with the truth of how God sees us.

#### CONNECT

Did you have any insights to share from the five-day reading plan?

Play the game "Two Truths and a Lie." Each group member will share three things about themselves—two of which are true and one of which is a lie. Have the other group members guess which is the lie. If your group is large, you may consider separating into smaller groups in order to complete this exercise in 15–20 minutes. While we recognize that this is a game, it shows how easy it is to believe something that is untrue!

# LEARN

Discovering lies we've believed about ourselves takes work. Some of these beliefs have been established for many years. Do not be discouraged if some people in your group readily see lies they've believed and it takes more time for you to see them. There is comfort in knowing that we can ask God for help. Before beginning the discussion, someone in the group can pray. Feel free to use this prayer as a guide:

Heavenly Father, Thank you for sending us Jesus, who did for us what we couldn't do for ourselves. Because of what Jesus's death and resurrection, we can be called your son or daughter not based on our own efforts but on what Jesus did for us. Thank you that you give us your Spirit to be our helper and to lead us to truth. We pray that each of us will see clearly any lies we may have believed and learn how to replace these lies with the truth of how you see us. Amen.

After praying, watch the video for Session 2.





#### **APPLY**

- 1. What's your initial reaction to the video? What stood out to you?
- 2. If you haven't done so, take a moment to look at the false beliefs from the Session 1 Discussion Guide and pinpoint one that you feel applies to you. Which one did you pick, and why do you think you started to believe that?
- 3. Identify situations that trigger your false beliefs. If they've developed over time, it may take some reflection to consider people, places or situations that trigger our false beliefs. The key is to catch the these thoughts early before they have time to grow.
- 4. Now look at False Beliefs vs. Truths on page 3 of this guide. What is the corresponding truth to your false belief? What is the passage of scripture that corresponds to the truth statement? Share what this truth means to you. How could you re-phrase this to make it personal for you?
- 5. Take a moment to write down your truth statement on one side of your card, and the passage of scripture on the other side.
- 6. If you began to replace your false belief with the truth statement, how could that impact your day to day life? Could it help with your satisfaction, security, or significance needs? If so, how?
- 7. Read Romans 12:2. In light of this study, what stands out to you about this verse?

#### PRAY

End your time with a prayer. Ask God to help each person in the group remember their truth when they are tempted to believe a lie.

Do not confirm to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will.

# FALSE BELIEFS VS. TRUTHS

Look back at the false beliefs you checked during Session 1 and select the corresponding boxes below. Take some time to read through the opposing truths that relate to the beliefs you selected. Next time the false belief crops up, see if you can focus your mind around the truth instead of giving that false belief power over your thoughts and actions.

FALSE BELIEFS	TRUTH
