

# SPIRITUAL PATHWAYS DISCUSSION GUIDE

#### CONNECT

Pick a story card that best represents how you relate to God.

If you don't have access to story cards, ask the question, "When do you feel most connected to God?"

### LEARN

Open with prayer, then watch the "Spiritual Pathway" video.

Wonder Pathways: In Awe of Who God Is and What He Has Done

- Naturalists: Loving God outdoors
- Sensates: Loving God with the senses (singing, dancing, and art)
- Traditionalists: Loving God by pausing and reflecting

Contemplative Pathways: Connecting to God in Spaces to Reflect by Themselves

- Ascetics: Loving God in solitude and simplicity
- Contemplative: Loving God through thinking deeply
- Intellectuals: Loving God with the mind (read, listen, and process)

Action Pathways: Energy and Desire to Do Things for Jesus

- Activists: Loving God through creating solutions
- Caregivers: Loving God by loving others
- Enthusiasts: Loving God through celebration

- If you are married, what is your spouse's spiritual pathway? Is it different than yours? What is one way you can support and encourage your spouse to pursue God through their spiritual pathway?
